

Trend: On a per student basis, the frequency of crimes on the campuses of FSU, FAMU, and TCC have been lower in the 2010s than they were in the 2000s. The Clery Act requires that all postsecondary institutions participating in title IV student financial assistance programs disclose campus crime statistics and other security information to students and the public.
