
Population: Educational Attainment

Trend: The level of educational attainment has steadily increased in Leon County. As of 2024, 51.2% of Leon County residents 25 years and over had obtained a Bachelor's degree or higher, up from 41.7% in 2000. In comparison, 35.8% of State of Florida residents and 36.8% of US residents 25 years and over had obtained a Bachelor's degree or higher. Some 53.9% of Tallahassee city residents had a bachelor's degree or higher.
